Legal Violations and Risky Conduct (UK Law)

1. Dangerous / Careless Driving

- Offense: The video appears to be recorded while driving, even if using a mounted device.
- Under the Road Traffic Act 1988 and Highway Code, recording oneself—despite being hands-free—can still constitute careless driving (Section 3) if it causes distraction or loss of proper control.
- o Mounted recording while talking at length may impair focus and still be interpreted as endangerment, especially if accidents are mentioned.

2. Operating as a Charity without Registration or Transparency
