Dear Sir/Madam,

Thank you for your email.

We acknowledge receipt of your correspondence entitled "Request for Removal of Data."

At present, we are unable to identify the content to which your request relates or determine the legal basis upon which you seek removal. Consequently, we are unable to commence any substantive review until sufficient information has been provided.

As the data controller, we have a legal obligation to consider requests carefully and objectively. We also have legal obligations to preserve lawful material where publication is justified, including where processing is carried out for journalistic, academic, archival, public interest, legal, or evidential purposes. We therefore require sufficient information to properly identify the material in question and assess your request against the applicable provisions of the UK General Data Protection Regulation ("UK GDPR"), the Data Protection Act 2018, and any other relevant legislation.

Please complete the enclosed Data Subject Request Form and return it together with all supporting documentation.

Your request should include, as a minimum:

1. Identity of the Requester

Please provide:

- Your full legal name.
- Your current postal address.
- A contact telephone number.
- An email address for correspondence.

Where appropriate, we may request proof of identity before any personal data is disclosed or actioned. Such verification is intended solely to protect the rights and freedoms of individuals and to prevent unauthorised requests.

2. Capacity

Please confirm whether you are:

- the individual whose personal data is the subject of the request;
- a legal representative;
- a solicitor instructed by the data subject;
- a person holding a valid power of attorney; or
- another authorised representative.

If acting on behalf of another individual, documentary evidence of your authority must be supplied.

3. Identification of the Material

Please identify precisely every item you request be reviewed, including:

- the exact URL;
- the page title;

- the publication date (if known);
- screenshots;
- image numbers or filenames (where applicable);
- the specific photograph(s);
- the specific paragraph(s) or wording complained of.

General references to an entire website or Facebook group are insufficient to enable identification of the material.

4. Legal Basis

Please specify the precise statutory basis upon which your request is made.

For example:

- Article 17 UK GDPR (Right to Erasure);
- Article 21 UK GDPR (Right to Object);
- Article 16 UK GDPR (Right to Rectification);
- another statutory provision.

Please explain why you believe that provision applies.

5. Grounds Relied Upon

Please explain in detail:

- why you believe continued processing is unlawful;
- why you believe publication is inaccurate;
- whether you dispute factual accuracy;
- whether you dispute identification;
- whether you contend publication serves no legitimate purpose.

General statements requesting removal are insufficient.

6. Supporting Evidence

Please provide copies of all documents upon which you rely.

Depending upon the grounds advanced, this may include:

- court orders;
- judgments;
- injunctions;
- solicitor correspondence;
- claim numbers;
- court references;
- ICO correspondence;
- evidence demonstrating factual inaccuracies;
- documents supporting your assertions;
- any other material relied upon.

If your request relies upon ongoing legal proceedings, please provide:

- the court in which proceedings have been issued;
- the claim number;
- the names of the parties;
- the status of proceedings;
- the legal representatives involved.

A general assertion that legal proceedings exist is not, of itself, sufficient to establish that removal is legally required.

7. Remedy Requested

Please explain precisely what remedy you seek.

For example:

- complete removal;
- anonymisation;
- redaction;
- rectification;
- correction;
- blurring of an image.

If requesting blurring or redaction, please explain why this would be an appropriate and proportionate remedy.

8. Declaration

Please confirm that:

- the information supplied is true and accurate;
- you understand that knowingly making false representations may affect consideration of your request;
- all supporting documents are genuine.

Assessment

Upon receipt of a completed request together with sufficient supporting information, we will assess the matter in accordance with our obligations under the UK GDPR and Data Protection Act 2018.

Please note that receipt of a request does not create an automatic obligation to remove published material.

Where publication is lawful, accurate, proportionate, supported by evidence, or falls within exemptions recognised by law, including those relating to freedom of expression, journalism, legal proceedings, public interest, or the establishment, exercise, or defence of legal claims, removal may not be appropriate.

If insufficient information is supplied to identify the material or determine the legal basis relied upon, we reserve the right to request further information before the statutory time for responding begins to run, insofar as permitted by applicable legislation.

We will acknowledge a completed request once all necessary information has been received.
